“The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel (which means ‘God with us’).” – Matthew 1:23

December ushers in the wonder of Advent and Christmas. Lights twinkle, carols rise, and hearts prepare to celebrate the birth of Jesus—the greatest gift the world has ever known. Yet with every candle, hymn, and manger scene comes one profound and unchanging truth: **God is with us.** Not far off. Not distant. **But with us.** With us in our joy and in our sorrow. With us in our work, our play, and our worship. With us in the quiet moments no one else sees and in the hectic crowds of the holiday season.

As we celebrate Advent and Christmas this year, remember that the Christ who came so long ago still comes today—into your home, into your church, and into your heart. So help me carry His presence out into the world so that others can also experience the wonder of “God with us.”

A Simple Christmas Challenge - This season, I invite each of you to choose **one intentional act** that reflects God’s nearness—offering encouragement, extending forgiveness, serving a neighbor, giving generously, or bringing someone our cantata, to Christmas dinner, or to worship. Small actions, guided by Christ’s presence, can make a meaningful

difference. Remember: God is with us always—even to the end of the age.

What's New with the Mission Team?

Thank you to our High Street Church family for your continuous and very generous support of our projects to help others. Recently we have collected 226 razors and 31 cans of shaving cream for the Franklin Cooperative Ministries, sent a check for \$1500 for the Backpack Feeding Program at S.P. Morton Elementary School to support 25 food-insufficient children for the first half of the school year, sent a check for \$1,000 to continue our support of the Wings of Caring Aviation Ministry in the Democratic Republic of the Congo in Africa, and sent a check for \$1,000 to UMCOR for the relief efforts after the devastating Hurricane Melissa that hit Jamaica and other islands recently.

We also decided to support our local Foodbank with a \$1,000 donation to help during the recent surge in food prices and the absence of SNAP benefits. Our Thanksgiving food collection for residents of Southampton County who are experiencing food insecurity this holiday season was a great success! We were able to have a special blessing for the food and its recipients at both worship services on Sunday, November 16th.

Then members of the Mission Team organized and delivered all of the food to the Department of Social Services in Southampton County for them to distribute to the people in need. We were also able to provide 40 \$25 Food Lion gift cards to help with the purchase of hams or turkeys.

The HSUMC Mission Garden is going great this fall season! Thanks to our farmer Jeff Brown for his expertise and hard work in planting, growing, and harvesting a bountiful crop of collards and cabbage for the Franklin Foodbank. Jim Jervy, Mike Ponder, Galen Butler and Kathy Brown have been helping with the harvesting as well.

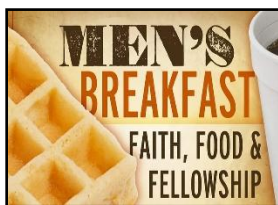
